

<u>General Assembly Passes Local WSSC Water Legislation</u>: Prior to their adjournment of Sine Die on Monday, the Maryland General Assembly passed <u>HB 399</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Minority Business Enterprise Utilization Program – Termination Extension (PG/MC 105-22); <u>HB 400</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Hiring and Promotion Preferences – Veterans and Their Spouses (PG/MC 106-22); and <u>HB 526</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Plumbing and Fuel Gas Services – Licenses and Penalties (PG/MC 109-22). All three bills will be sent to the Governor for his consideration to sign them into law.

<u>The Maryland General Assembly Adjourns Sine Die</u>: On Monday, April 11th at midnight, the Maryland General Assembly wrapped up their 444th Legislative Session and adjourned *Sine Die*. The 2022 Session brought some normalcy back to Annapolis as the Senate held in-person public hearings for the first time in two years. Legislators introduced 2,500 pieces of legislation for consideration during the 90-day Session. The General Assembly will convene for their 445th Legislative Session at noon on January 11, 2023.

<u>WSSC Water Celebrates Successful Session</u>: WSSC Water's **Intergovernmental Relations Office (IRO)** had another successful Session with three bills supported by the Commission passed and awaiting signature at the Governor's desk. In addition to tracking nearly 300 bills, they collaborated with trade organizations and stakeholders to advocate for and against other statewide bills impacting the Commission.

Legislative Updates

Please find below the status of the three WSSC Water sponsored bills:

<u>HB 399</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Minority Business Enterprise Utilization Program – Termination Extension (PG/MC105-22), extends the statutory authority for the WSSC Minority Business Enterprise Utilization (MBE) Program for a period of one year ending on June 30, 2023. The bill was passed by the General Assembly and awaits action by the Governor. The law becomes effective on June 1, 2022.

<u>HB 400</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Hiring and Promotion Preferences – Veterans and Their Spouses (PG/MC 106-22), repeals the current statute pertaining to the WSSC Water competitive selection process for appointments of veterans and adopts the processes utilized by the State of Maryland. The bill passed the General Assembly unanimously and awaits action by the Governor. The law becomes effective on October 1, 2022.

<u>HB 526</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Plumbing and Fuel Gas Services – Licenses and Penalties, Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Plumbing and Fuel Gas Services – Licenses and Penalties (PG/MC 109-22), authorizes WSSC Water, in addition to other penalties, to impose a penalty not exceeding \$5,000 for each violation to persons who violate provisions of the WSSC Plumbing and Fuel Gas Code or State Law. The bill was passed by the General Assembly and awaits action by the Governor. The law becomes effective on October 1, 2022.

Maryland Board of Public Works Approves More than \$22 Million in Loans and Grants to WSSC Water

On Tuesday, April 6, 2022, the Maryland Board of Public Works (BPW) approved more than \$22 million in loans and grants to WSSC Water to help Maryland's largest water utility continue its efforts to protect local waterways and the Chesapeake Bay.

An estimated \$15 million will help fund the ongoing design and construction of WSSC Water's <u>Piscataway Bioenergy</u> facility in Accokeek, Maryland, in Prince George's County. Construction on the \$271 million project began in spring 2019 and is expected to be substantially complete by November 2024.

The Bay Restoration Fund Grants totaling an estimated \$7.7 million, will help fund WSSC Water's Sewer Reconstruction Program. The comprehensive program replaces and rehabilitates pipes and manholes in areas where sewer mains leak, have become damaged, or have reached the end of their useful life.
