

A Note from WSSC Water's Intergovernmental Relations Office (IRO):

<u>General Assembly Passes Local WSSC Water Legislation</u>: With just minutes to spare prior to adjournment of Sine Die on Monday, the Senate of Maryland unanimously passed <u>HB 501 (MC/PG 102-21)</u> – *Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission* – *Board of Ethics* – *Financial Disclosure Statements* – *Late Fees* and <u>HB 789 (MC/PG 100-21)</u> – *Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission* – *Video Streaming and Archiving Meetings and Late Payment Charges*. Both pieces of legislation will be sent to the Governor for his consideration to become law.

<u>The Maryland General Assembly Adjourns Sine Die</u>: On Monday, April 12th at midnight, The Maryland General Assembly adjourned the 442nd Legislative Session *Sine Die*. While pandemic restrictions caused nearly all the legislature's work to be conducted virtually, legislators introduced 2,344 pieces of legislation for consideration during the 90-day Session. The General Assembly will convene for their 443rd Legislative Session at noon on January 12, 2022.

<u>WSSC Water Celebrates Successful Session</u>: WSSC Water's **Intergovernmental Relations Office (IRO)** had another successful Session with three bills (two local and one statewide) supported by Commission passed and awaiting signature at the Governor's desk. In addition to tracking over 300 bills, they collaborated with trade organizations and stakeholders to advocate for and against several other statewide bills impacting the Commission.

Legislative Updates

<u>HB 501 (MC/PG 102-21)</u> – *Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission* – *Board of Ethics* – *Financial Disclosure Statements* – *Late Fees:* SUPPORT. This WSSC Watersponsored bill will authorize the WSSC Water Board of Ethics to impose a fee to individuals who file late or fail to file a financial disclosure statement. The bill passed unanimously in the House and Senate, and awaits action by the Governor. The law becomes effective June 1, 2021.

<u>HB 561</u> – *Renewable Energy Portfolio Standard* – *Wastewater, Thermal, and Other Renewable Sources:* SUPPORT. As amended, HB 561 expands Tier 1 renewable energy sources in the State's Renewable Energy Portfolio Standard to include raw or treated wastewater used as a heat source or heat sink for a heating or cooling system, subject to specified requirements. The bill allows producers of energy generated from wastewater heating or cooling systems to receive renewable energy credits. The bill was passed by the General Assembly and awaits action by Governor. The law becomes effective on July 1, 2021.

<u>HB 789</u> (MC/PG 100-21) – Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Video Streaming and Archiving Meetings and Late Payment Charges: SUPPORT w/ Amendment. This bill requires the Commission to livestream its open meetings and to maintain a complete and unedited archived recording of each open meeting. Additionally, the bill specifies that financial assistance provided as part of the Customer Assistance Program can include the reduction or waiver of fees, including late fees. The bill passed unanimously in the House and Senate, and now awaits action by the Governor. The law becomes effective October 1, 2021.

Around WSSC Water

WSSC Water FY 2022 Budget and CIP Bi-County Review and Approval

WSSC Water FY 2022 Operating Budget and FY 22-27 CIP are working their way through the Bi-County review and approval process.

- On April 6, the Prince George's County Council held a <u>Public Hearing</u> on WSSC Water's budget, and on April 8, a <u>Work Session</u> was held on WSSC Water's Operating Budget/CIP.
- On April 13, the Montgomery County Council reviewed <u>WSSC Water's FY 22-27</u> <u>CIP</u> and on April 15, the T&E Committee held a work session on the <u>FY 2022</u> <u>Operating Budget</u>.
- On May 13, the Montgomery County and Prince George's County Councils will meet to approve the WSSC Water CIP and Operating Budget, as well as any other Bi-County budget issues.
