

The Maryland General Assembly continues their work on over 2,400 bills that have been introduced to date.

WSSC Water's **Intergovernmental Relations Office (IRO)** advocates for legislation that helps WSSC Water fulfill our mission to provide safe and reliable water, life's most precious resource, and return clean water to our environment, all in an ethical, sustainable, and financially responsible manner.

The Annapolis Observer is IRO's weekly update on happenings in Annapolis and provides updates on key bills of interest to WSSC Water.

Legislative Updates

All WSSC Water sponsored bills have passed unanimously out of the House Delegations of Montgomery and Prince George's counties, and are moving through their assigned House standing committees.

Two bills, HB 399 and HB 400, have received favorable recommendations from the respective subcommittees, and will be sent to the full standing committees for consideration:

HB 399 Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Minority Business Enterprise Utilization Program – Termination Extension, extends the statutory authority for the WSSC Minority Business Enterprise Utilization (MBE) Program for a period of one year ending on June 30, 2023. The authority to conduct the MBE program is set to end on July 1, 2022. The bill was heard before the House Health and Government Operations Committee on February 8th. The Government Operations and Health Facilities Subcommittee issued a unanimous favorable recommendation on HB 399 on February 16th. The bill will be presented to the entire Committee before it is sent to the House floor for a final vote.

HB 400 Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Hiring and Promotion Preferences – Veterans and Their Spouses, repeals the current statute pertaining to the WSSC Water competitive selection process for appointments of veterans and adopts the processes utilized by the State of Maryland. The bill was heard before the House Environment and Transportation Committee on February 15th. The Local Government and Bi-County Agencies Subcommittee met on February 17th and unanimously voted for a recommendation on HB 400. The bill will be presented to the entire Committee before it is sent to the House floor for a final vote.

The third bill, <u>HB 526</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Plumbing and Fuel Gas Services – Licenses and Penalties, was heard on February 22nd in the House Economic Matters Committee.

Water Service Line Emergency Replacement Loan (PipeER)

PipeER is a loan to help finance the replacement of a leaking residential water service line. Qualified customers are eligible to receive a loan up to \$5,000. PipeER is administered by the WSSC Federal Credit Union (WSSC FCU) in partnership with WSSC Water.

Each year, up to \$100,000 in total is available on a first-come, first-served basis until the fund is depleted. On July 1st of each year, any remaining funds are donated to the WSSC Water Fund.
