

A Note from WSSC Water's Intergovernmental Relations Office (IRO):

Maryland lawmakers have (virtually) hit the ground running and began bill hearings during the first full week of the General Assembly's 444th Legislative Session. To date, legislators have introduced 685 bills for consideration. On Wednesday, Governor Larry Hogan presented his recorded setting \$58.2 billion budget which bolsters the state's rainy day fund to record levels, provides tax relief to retirees and working families, and expands relief to vulnerable Marylanders. Senate and House members in the Budget & Taxation and Appropriations committees will now begin their work to pass a balanced budget by early April.

WSSC Water's **Intergovernmental Relations Office (IRO)** is on the frontline advocating for legislation that impacts our work. IRO covers a variety of subject matters and focuses on legislation that helps WSSC Water fulfill our mission to provide safe and reliable water, life's most precious resource, and return clean water to our environment, all in an ethical, sustainable, and financially responsible manner.

The Annapolis Observer is IRO's weekly update on happenings in Annapolis and highlights the progress of key bills and updates of interest to WSSC Water.

Legislative Updates

On January 21st, the Prince George's County House Delegation voted unanimously to pass <u>PG/MC 105-22</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Minority Business Enterprise Utilization Program – Termination Extension and <u>PG/MC 106-22</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Hiring and Promotion Preferences – Veterans and Their Spouses, Favorable. These bills will now move to the House Environment and Transportation Committee for consideration.

The Montgomery County House Delegation also met on January 21st and voted unanimously to pass <u>PG/MC 109-22</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Plumbing and Fuel Gas Services – Licenses and Penalties, Favorable. This bill will now move to the Prince George's County Delegation for consideration.

Around WSSC Water

As Temperatures Drop, Water Main Breaks Increase

As colder temperatures settle into the region, WSSC Water crews are prepared for the increase in breaks and leaks with people, pipes, trucks and tools at the ready. Every year, WSSC Water responds to approximately 1,800 water main breaks; 1,200 of them between the months of November and February.

WSSC Water experiences an increase in water main breaks and leaks a few days after the temperature of the Potomac River hits a new low. The river is the primary source of drinking water for 1.9 million WSSC Water customers in Montgomery and Prince George's counties. When a new low temperature is reached, the colder water can shock pipes, increasing the number of breaks and leaks.

Customers are encouraged to report water main breaks and leaks as quickly as possible.

There are three simple ways to report a break or leak to WSSC Water's 24-hour Emergency Services Center:

The Report a Problem feature on the mobile app allows customers to easily snap a picture of a possible water main break or leak and send it directly to the Emergency Services Center. The app uses GPS to pinpoint the location of the image, which allows dispatchers to send an inspector to the site.

WSSC Water maintains the pipes in the streets and the connections up to the property line. If a pipe in a home freezes, it is the homeowner's responsibility to repair. For more information, including tips on what customers can do to help winterize their homes, visit www.wsscwater.com/winterready.

WSSC Water will hold public hearings on February 2nd and 3rd at 7 pm to receive comments on our \$1.59 billion preliminary proposed Fiscal Year 2023 operating and capital budget. This budget details the projects and initiatives we plan to undertake that will enable us to deliver safe, seamless and satisfying water services to our neighbors in Montgomery and Prince George's counties.
