

With Crossover having passed on March 21 st, lawmakers are laser focused on getting their bills through the legislative process before the General Assembly adjourns *Sine Die* on April 11 th. There have been 2,497 bills introduced thus far during the 2022 Legislative Session.

Earlier this week, the Senate Budget and Taxation, and Finance Committees, respectively, held their bill hearings for HB 399 *Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Minority Business Enterprise Utilization Program – Termination Extension PG/MC 105-22 – Termination Extension*, and HB 400 *Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Hiring and Promotion Preferences – Veterans and Their Spouses PG/MC 106-22*. These bills have received favorable recommendations from both the Montgomery County and Prince George's County Senate Delegations.

WSSC Water's **Intergovernmental Relations Office (IRO)** advocates for legislation that helps WSSC Water fulfill our mission to provide safe and reliable water, life's most precious resource, and return clean water to our environment, all in an ethical, sustainable, and financially responsible manner.

The Annapolis Observer is IRO's weekly update on happenings in Annapolis and provides updates on key bills of interest to WSSC Water.

Legislative Updates

Please find below the status of the three WSSC Water sponsored bills:

<u>HB 399</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Minority Business Enterprise Utilization Program – Termination Extension (PG/MC105-22), extends the statutory authority for the WSSC Minority Business Enterprise Utilization (MBE) Program for a period of one year ending on June 30, 2023. On February 24th, the bill was passed by the House of Delegates by a vote of 131-2. The Senate bill hearing before the Budget and Taxation Committee was held on Match 23rd. HB 399 has received favorable recommendation from the Montgomery County and Prince George's County Senate Delegations.

HB 400 Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Hiring and Promotion Preferences – Veterans and Their Spouses (PG/MC 106-22), repeals the current statute pertaining to the WSSC Water competitive selection process for appointments of veterans and adopts the processes utilized by the State of Maryland. The House of Delegates voted unanimously to pass HB 400 on March 9th. The Senate bill before the Finance Committee was held on March 24th. HB 399 has received favorable recommendation from the Montgomery County and Prince George's County Senate Delegations.

<u>HB 526</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Plumbing and Fuel Gas Services – Licenses and Penalties, Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Plumbing and Fuel Gas Services – Licenses and Penalties (PG/MC 109-22), authorizes WSSC Water, in addition to other penalties, to impose a penalty not exceeding \$5,000 for each violation to persons who violate provisions of the WSSC Plumbing and Fuel Gas Code or State Law. On March 17th, the bill was passed by the House of Delegates by a vote of 122-15. The Senate Finance Committee will hold their bill hearing for HB 526 on March 29th. The Montgomery County Senate Delegation issued a favorable recommendation for HB 526.

The Prince George's County Senate Delegation will meet on April 1St to consider their recommendation.

WSSC Water Commissioners' Engineering Scholarship – Application Deadline is March 31st

The deadline to apply to WSSC Water's 2022 Commissioners' Engineering Scholarship is March 31st. This scholarship seeks to attract aspiring engineers to careers in the water industry. Scholarship winners receive \$2,000 per year and up to \$8,000 over four consecutive years.

The scholarship is open to students with permanent residency in Montgomery or Prince George's County who are enrolled in a full-time college or university engineering program. High school seniors already accepted into an engineering program are also eligible. Winners also receive priority consideration for paid summer internship opportunities at WSSC Water. Emergency Work in Your Area

Customers are also encouraged to sign up for WSSC Water's <u>Customer Notification System (CNS)</u> to receive texts or email alerts about WSSC Water related work.

Water Service Line Emergency Replacement Loan Program or PipeER

PipeER provides a loan to finance the replacement of a leaking residential water service line. Qualified customers are eligible to receive a loan up to \$5,000. PipeER is administered by the WSSC Federal Credit Union (WSSC FCU) in partnership with WSSC Water.

This loan program makes \$100,000 available annually to customers. Funds are available on a first-come, first-served basis, each fiscal year until the fund is depleted. Any funds remaining on July 1 each year are donated to The WSSC Water Fund, which helps WSSC Water customers pay their water and sewer bills.
