

A Note from WSSC Water's Intergovernmental Relations Office (IRO):

The Maryland General Assembly convened to begin its 442nd Legislative Session on January 13, 2021. Delegate Adrienne Jones has been re-elected to serve as Speaker of the House and Senator Bill Ferguson has been re-elected as President of the Senate. This will be an unprecedented Legislative Session as the COVID-19 pandemic has forced most of the legislature's work, except floor sessions, to be conducted virtually.

The COVID-19 pandemic has influenced the major topics for the Session to include assistance for residents and businesses impacted by the pandemic, educational funding, police reforms, and addressing health disparities in the State of Maryland.

WSSC Water's **Intergovernmental Relations Office (IRO)** will continue its role in advocating for legislation that supports the work of WSSC Water. **IRO** covers a variety of subject matter and focuses on legislation that helps advance WSSC Water's mission to provide safe and reliable water, life's most precious resource, and return clean water to our environment, all in an ethical, sustainable, and financially responsible manner. IRO looks at all legislation that impacts WSSC Water's administrative, operational and financial capability.

Legislative Updates

WSSC Water has introduced <u>MC/PG 102-21</u> – Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Board of Ethics – Financial Disclosure Statements – Late Fees that will authorize the WSSC Board of Ethics to impose a fee to individuals who file late or fail to file a financial disclosure statement.

On January 7th, the Montgomery County House Delegation voted unanimously to pass <u>MC/PG 100-21</u> – Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Video Streaming and Archiving Meetings and Late Payment Charges, Favorable with Amendments. The bill now moves to the Prince George's County House Delegation for consideration. Staff met with the bill sponsor to address concerns raised by the Commissioners and the bill, as amended, addresses those concerns.

Around WSSC Water

WSSC Water Continues Moratorium on Late Fees and Shut-Offs

Months into the pandemic, WSSC Water is experiencing an increase in the amount of money owed to WSSC Water: As of the end of December 2020, there was \$64.1 million past-due accounts (approximately 90,000 accounts), compared to \$36 million past-due accounts (approximately 75,000 accounts) at the end of December 2019.

In spite of this, WSSC Water is committed to ensuring water is available to all customers during this public health crisis; as a result, WSSC Water continues **to suspend service shutoffs and waive late fees**. We have ramped up our assistance efforts to ensure that safe, clean water continues to reliably flow to customer's homes during these difficult times.
