

#### A Note from WSSC Water's Intergovernmental Relations Office

The General Assembly continues to work feverishly on more than 2,200 bills as the crossover deadline fast approaches. A backlog of bills is often seen the first year of a four-year term, but with nearly one-third of the Senate bills introduced right at the bill filing deadline, it is anticipated that some bills may not crossover to the opposite chamber in time.

On Friday, February 24, Ashanti Martinez was sworn into the Maryland House of Delegates, as the newest member of the Prince George's County Delegation, where he will represent District 22. Martinez will serve on the Government and Operations Committee. On Monday, February 27, Ariana Kelly, who served more than 12 years in the House of Delegates, was sworn into the Maryland Senate, where she will represent District 16 in Montgomery County. The Montgomery County Democratic Central Committee is expected to submit a nominee's name to fill the vacant District 16 delegate seat by March 21, 2023.

WSSC Water's **Intergovernmental Relations Office (IRO)** is on the front-line advocating for legislation that impacts our work. **IRO** covers a variety of subject matters and focuses on legislation that helps WSSC Water fulfill our mission to provide safe and reliable water, life's most precious resource, and return clean water to our environment, all in an ethical, sustainable, and financially responsible manner.

The Annapolis Observer is **IRO's** weekly update on happenings in Annapolis and highlights the progress of key bills of interest to WSSC Water, as well as provide timely updates and calendar of important dates.

## **Legislative Updates**

WSSC Water has proposed one bill for the 2023 Legislative Session. HB 783 (MC/PG 101-23) - Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission - Minority Business Enterprise Utilization Program - Revisions and Extension. This bill updates, modernizes, streamlines, and strengthens provisions pertaining to WSSC Water's Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) Utilization Program, including extending the Office of Supplier Diversity and Inclusion's statutory authority to have an MBE program for five (5) years, ending on June 30, 2028.

The Prince George's County House Delegation unanimously passed <u>HB 783 (MC/PG 101-23)</u> with amendments on February 24, 2023. The bill now moves to the Montgomery County House Delegation for consideration. The Montgomery County Metro Washington Area Committee is scheduled to have a work session on March 6, 2023 where they will discuss HB 783.

Another bill of interest that would impact WSSC Water is <u>HB 872 (MC/PG 111-23)</u>. This bill authorizes WSSC Water to enter into contracts with the District of Columbia or the District of Columbia Water and Sewer Authority for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a water supply, sewer, or drainage system for certain properties located within a regional transit district in Prince George's County.

This legislation was introduced at the request of the County Executive. WSSC Water is

working with their office on a dual track and has proposed amendments to limit the impact of the bill in addition to working on a technical, non-legislative resolution.

The Prince George's County Bi-County Committee held a work session on March 2, 2023 and encouraged all parties to continue their work to find a non-legislative resolution. The Committee will hold their next work session on March 9, 2023 at 9:00 am to receive a progress update and potentially vote on HB 872.

WSSC Water will continue to champion policies that provide safe and reliable water and return clean water to our environment, all in an ethical, sustainable and financially responsible manner.

#### **EMERGENCY REPAIRS AND CONSTRUCTION**

The first step to repairing a water main break is you; please call 301-206-4002 immediately! A water main break leaves hundreds of people without service so we take them seriously!

After water main repair work is completed, customers should flush the COLD-water lines in the home or business using the following steps:

- Run all COLD water taps for about five minutes or until the water runs clear.
- Begin with the lowest faucet in the home or business and then open the other faucets one at a time, moving from the lowest floor to the highest.
- Once the water runs clear, usually in five minutes or less, turn off the faucets in the same order – lowest to highest.
- Don't forget to flush refrigerator lines!

# WSSC WATER ADOPTS REGULATIONS FOR MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISE ("MBE") PROGRAM

On January 18, 2023, the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (Commission) adopted regulations revising Chapter 6.30 of the WSSC Code of Regulations 2021 (Code), Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) Program. The revisions concern the Commission's efforts to clarify the MBE eligibility criteria and the Commission's race-neutral efforts to remedy past discrimination consistent with the 2022 Disparity Study.

The regulations are authorized by Maryland Annotated Code, Public Utilities Article, Division II, §17-402, permitting the Commission to adopt rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of the Public Utilities Article, Division II.
